### In Al-Anon, we learn . . .

Not to suffer because of the actions or reactions of other people.

- Not to allow ourselves to be used or abused by others in the interest of another's recovery.
- Not to do for others what they could do for themselves.
- Not to manipulate situations so others will eat, get up, pay bills, not drink.
- Not to cover up for anyone's mistakes or misdeeds.
- Not to create a crisis.
- Not to prevent a crisis if it is in the natural course of events.

### What is Al-Anon?

The Al-Anon Family Groups are a fellowship of relatives and friends of alcoholics who share their experience, strength, and hope in order to solve their common problems.

We believe alcoholism is a family illness and that changed attitudes can aid in recovery. Al-Anon is not allied with any sect, denomination, political entity, organization, or institution. It does not engage in any controversy; neither endorses nor opposes any cause.

There are no dues for membership. Al-Anon is self-supporting through its own voluntary contributions.

Al-Anon has but one purpose: to help families of alcoholics. We do this by practicing the Twelve Steps, by welcoming and giving comfort to families of alcoholics, and by giving understanding and encouragement to the alcoholic.
